

The School Emblem



The cross in the upper right half of the shield is a Celtic cross, illuminated by a circle, representing the sun and symbolically, God as our true source of light. This symbol has a pagan origin, as pagans worshipped the sun. Thus, the superimposition of the cross over the sun represents Christ's baptism of non-believers.

In the lower left-hand corner of the shield is the Chirho, representing the first two letters of Christ's name in the Greek alphabet. Thus, the Chirho is a representation – a kind of shorthand – for Christ. This symbol was used especially in the early days of the church.

The Latin, Domine Doce Nos, translated means "Lord Teach Us." Indeed, we ask our Lord Jesus Christ to teach us as he did the people with whom he traveled. We ask for ways of holiness, wisdom, humility, truth, mercy, peace, charity, patience, and kindness.

The School Colors

The school colors stem from our school mascot, the Blue Angels. Like the colors of the Navy Blue Angels, the blue and white symbolize the dreams and pursuits of the horizon and purity from above. The accent of gold, represents a strength and firmness for righteousness and justice. We can indeed be proud to display our school colors.
